I congratulate the editorial team and all contributors for their sincere efforts in bringing out this publication. I hope this magazine motivates students to actively participate in learning, service, and professional development.

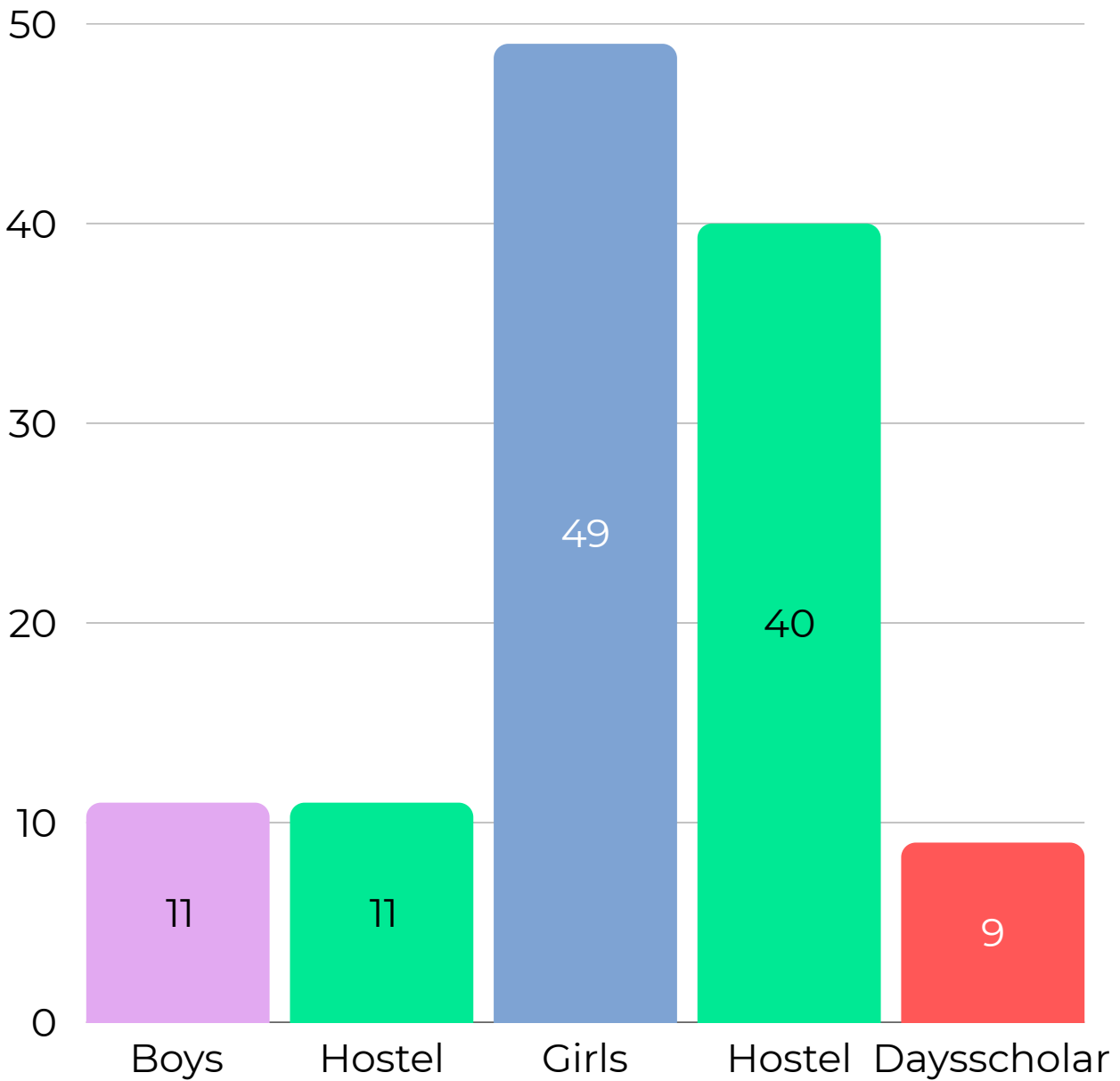

GUEST LECTURE

World Leprosy Day was observed on 30th January 2026 with the objective of creating awareness about Leprosy, its prevention, early detection, and elimination of stigma associated with the disease. The programme aimed to educate students and the public about the importance of early diagnosis and treatment.



The programme was organized by the Community Health Nursing Department. Faculty members and nursing students actively participated in the event.

A health awareness session was taken by K..Pallanisamy, Nallur PHC highlighted the causes, signs and symptoms, transmission, treatment, and prevention of leprosy. 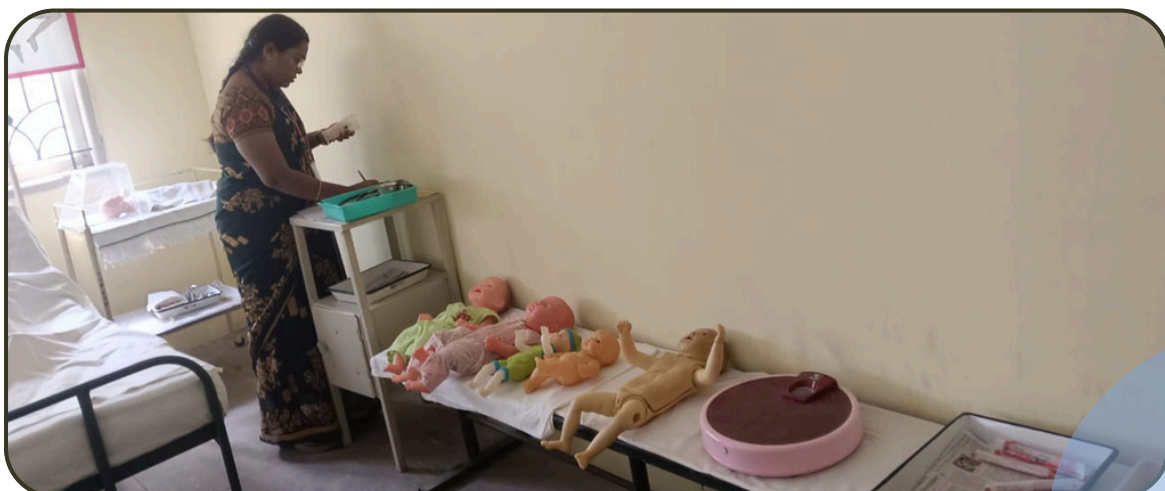

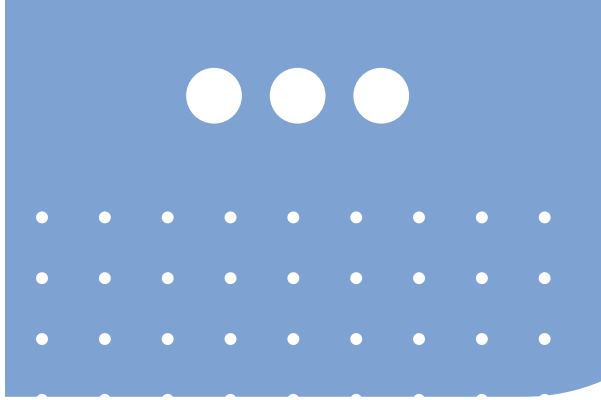
WORLD STROKE DAY OBSERVATION

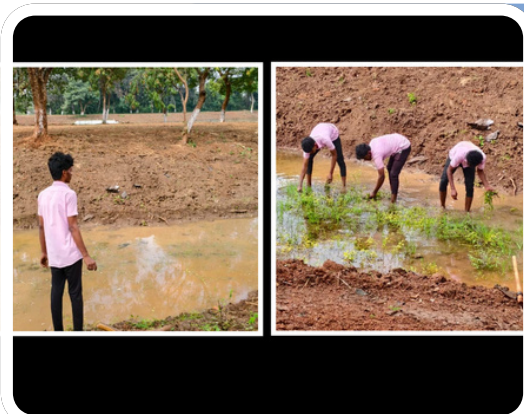
Let's Make Our Lake Shine Again

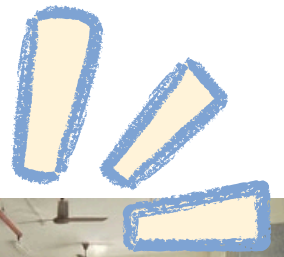
COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAMME REPORT

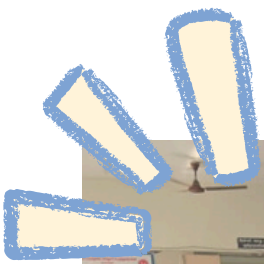


The program was successfully organized under the guidance of Ms. Vanitha, Asso prof and Ms. Sathyalavanya, Lecturer motivated and guided the students.

The program was successfully organized under the guidance of Ms.Sneha and Mr. Thamarai Kannan ,Lecturer who motivated and guided the students.

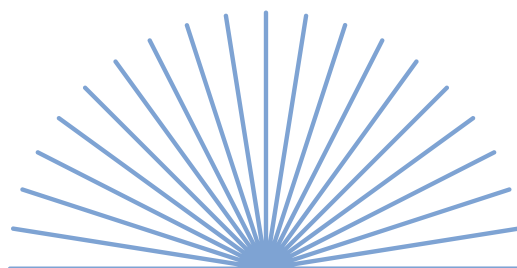




WORLD TB DAY

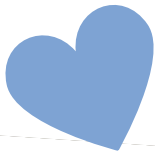
The programme concluded on a positive note, fostering unity and appreciation among all participants.
